

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A Message from our Patron

2021 was a year of great significance for the Outward Bound community, being exactly 80 years since the first ever Outward Bound course was delivered in Wales to develop the resilience of young sailors. Since then, operations have been established in 35 countries around the world. Here in Oman we are proud to be part of an international network, and to be the first operation established in the region.

The Covid pandemic ensured that 2021 was a challenging year for all of us. Despite those challenges, I am delighted to report that Outward Bound Oman continued to evolve and deliver, reaching out to more sectors of society and delivering a total of 144 training courses to a total of 1,752 participants, a number lower than previous years due to the need for physical distancing on our courses.

To maximise our impact and outreach, partnerships have been developed with organisations such as Dar Al Atta'a, the National Organisation of Scouts and Guides and The World Economic Forum Global Shapers-Muscat Hub. October 2021 saw the first group of several hundred people representing the emerging talent from the private sector come to Outward Bound as part of The Ministry of Labour Etimad course. End of course feedback has been extremely positive, and we look forward to continuing to support this programme in 2022 as we strive to develop the national talent of Oman in line with His Majesty's Vision 2040. As we continue to grow year on year we are able to recruit more staff to join the organisation, and 2021 saw 5 talented young Omanis join OBO, and enter the world of employment.

November 2021 saw us deliver our 1,000th training course, and in the coming year we will reach the milestone of 20,000 people trained. These milestones could not have been reached without the support of countless organisations and individuals in Oman, and to each and every one of you we extend a heartfelt thank-you. Together, by working in partnership we have created something very special, and we look forward to thanking you all properly later in 2022 when Covid allows.

Finally, I cannot end a review of 2021 without making reference to the construction of our third national training centre. Located high on Jebel Akdhar, and built with the very generous support of The Ministry of Energy and Minerals Social Investment Committee, the eye-catching design, use of renewable energy and spectacular location make the centre something of which Oman should be justifiably proud. We look forward to welcoming you there at some point this year.



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






THE OUTWARD BOUND OMAN Experiential Learning Model







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
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We **challenge** and **develop** the human capital of Oman

Our **growing** partnership with Government

Whilst much of our core work remains focused on developing the key life skills of the youth of Oman, and upskilling the unemployed, an increasing sector for us is working with the emerging talent of those already employed in both the government and private sectors -helping instil positive mindsets, attitudes and ethics people who are in the early stages of their careers. Nearly **250** such people have been trained in 2021 as part of The Ministry of Labour Etimad programme. The impact of your social investment

The challenges of the past year have seen budgets become tighter for all, putting more pressure on social investment managers to demonstrate a clear benefit and return on their social investment. One piece of SROI research undertaken by Sustainable Square identified that an investment of **1 OMR** into Outward Bound Oman had a social return of nearly **10 OMR**, an impressive outcome of which we are very proud.

One of the main headlines of 2021 for Outward Bound Oman was the construction of our third national training centre, located high on Jabal Akdhar. 
OUT WARD BOLLYS
